The first intercultural exchange was held on Sunday, September 11, 2022. Meeting at Ichikawa-Ono Station, seven people went on a walking tour to the following places:

Ichikawa City Zoo It was relaxing to see small animals and mini pigs.

Atelier & Café Anne of Green Gables Japanese and foreigners deepened exchanges over lunch on the terrace surrounded by flowers.

Takaharu-en Members picked Japanese pears (*nashi*) and tried samples. They learned about the nashi originating in Matsudo and received tips on how to pick this fruit. The varieties of nashi at this time were Kosui and Hosui. Juicy and with a good balance of tartness and sweetness, they were delicious. The tour ended at Ichikawa-Ono Station. Members were able to engage in active interaction. It was a day well spent.

2nd Event

The second intercultural exchange was held on Monday, October 10, 2022, a national holiday. Six people were met by a Matsudo City Guide at Matsudo Station.

The group visited the Tojo-tei, Tojo Museum of History, and Chiba University's Faculty of Horticulture. The Tojo-tei is a purely Japanese-style wooden house constructed in the Meiji Period for Tokugawa Akitake, the younger brother of the 15th and last shogun, Tokugawa Yoshinobu. It is the only Tokugawa residence that remains nearly in complete form.

Tour members also tried on armor made by the Matsudo Handmade Japanese Armor Club. They felt like samurai in the Warring States Period. Participants were pleased they could fully touch Japanese history and culture.


